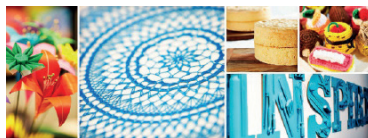

Any Exhibit not collected by 17th November 2017 shall become the property of the Society and be disposed of at their discretion.

1. Please see front of Homecrafts section for closing dates.
2. The Society will take all care, but will not be responsible for any loss or damage; the exhibits being the sole risk of the exhibitor.
3. The Society reserves the right to reject any entry that is considered to be sub-standard in either age or condition.
4. All exhibits must remain on display until 5:00pm on the closing day of the Show at which time they must be claimed by exhibitors after 5:30pm - 6:30pm Sunday 5th November or between 8:30am and 11:00am on Monday 6th November, otherwise no responsibility can be accepted.
5. No exhibit that has been shown at a previous Whittlesea Show is eligible for entry.
6. Prize money for Homecrafts only payable at the Homecrafts pavilion from 10am - 5pm on both days of the show and on Monday after the Show until 11:00am.

7. 7a. NOVICE CLASS: Open to any exhibitor who has never won a first prize for a similar item at any Agricultural Show.
- 7b. OPEN CLASS: Open to any exhibitors who have won a first prize in a Novice class.
- 7c. PROFESSIONAL CLASS: Open to exhibitors who teach (in a paid or voluntary capacity), operate a studio or who sell articles of a similar nature. In sections where there are Professional Classes, professionals are restricted to entering these classes only. Where there are no Professional Classes, professionals may enter Open Classes.
- 7d. MASTERS CLASS: Open to any exhibitors who have won one or more first prizes for similar items in an Open class.
8. Exhibits cannot be entered in more than one class.

Here's what you need: SQUARE TIN 20CM

250g sultanas

250g chopped raisins

250g currants

125g chopped mixed peel

90g chopped glace cherries

90g chopped blanched almonds

1/3 cup sherry or brandy

250g plain flour

60g self-raising flour

¼ teaspoon grated nutmeg

½ teaspoon ground ginger

½ teaspoon ground cloves

250g butter

250g soft brown sugar

½ teaspoon lemon essence OR

½ teaspoon almond essence

½ teaspoon vanilla essence

4 large eggs

Here's what you do:

1. Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight.

2. Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.

3. Place the mixture in a square tin no larger than 20cm square, straight sided, square cornered tin and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3½-4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

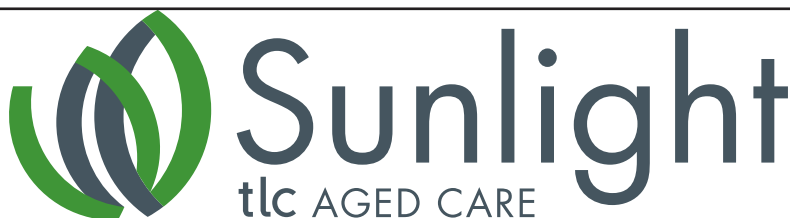
