## MECRAFT REGULATIONS

**Any Exhibit not collected by 17th November 2018 shall become the property of the Society and be disposed of at their discretion.**

1. Please see front of Homecrafts section for closing dates.
2. The Society will take all care, but will not be responsible for any loss or damage; the exhibits being the sole risk of the exhibitor.
3. The Society reserves the right to reject any entry that is considered to be sub-standard in either age or condition.
4. All exhibits must remain on display until 5:00pm on the closing day of the Show at which time they must be claimed by exhibitors **after 5:30pm - 6:30pm** Sunday 4th November or between 8:30am and 11:00am on Monday 5th November, otherwise no responsibility can be accepted.
5. No exhibit that has been shown at a previous Whittlesea Show is eligible for entry.

6. Prize money for Homecrafts only payable at the Homecrafts pavilion from 10am - 5pm on both days of the show and on Monday after the Show until 11:00am. Prize money totalling \$500 or more may be paid by Society cheque.
7.
  - 7a. NOVICE CLASS: Open to any exhibitor who has never won a first prize for a similar item at any Agricultural Show.
  - 7b. OPEN CLASS: Open to any exhibitors who have won a first prize in a Novice class.
  - 7c. PROFESSIONAL CLASS: Open to exhibitors who teach (in a paid or voluntary capacity), operate a studio or who sell articles of a similar nature. In sections where there are Professional Classes, professionals are restricted to entering these classes only. Where there are no Professional Classes, professionals may enter Open Classes.
  - 7d. MASTERS CLASS: Open to any exhibitors who have won one or more first prizes for similar items in an Open class.
8. Exhibits cannot be entered in more than one class.
9. The Society reserves the right to transfer an exhibit from any class to any other class.
10. For the purpose of determining an aggregate score, A first prize will equal 3 points, a second prize will equal 2 points and a third prize will equal 1 point, with the exception of Group S Class OPW (One Person's Work) where points will be 1st - 9 points, 2nd - 6 points and 3rd - 3 points.
11. Judges' decision is FINAL.
12. Articles must not have been previously worn or washed.

#### **Rule & Regulations**

1. **A Hand Knitted garment for an Infant/Child up to 3 years of age.**
2. Each exhibit must be made from pure wool/wool blend of any ply.
3. Exhibitor to attach label from wool used or receipt from the woollen mill.
4. Each exhibit entered must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.
5. An exhibit having won at a Show will compete at a Group Final. The winning exhibit will then compete in the State Final at the Royal Melbourne Show.
6. An exhibitor may represent only one local show at Group level and one Group at State level.
7. An exhibit having won at State Final is no longer eligible to compete in the competition.
8. If for any reason a winner is unable to compete at Group or State Final level then the second placegetter is eligible to compete.
9. A person will not be permitted to win at more than one Show within the State in any one Show year. Persons not adhering to this rule will be required to forfeit/refund prize money.
10. All work to have been completed in the last twelve (12) months prior to its entry at a local show/field day.
11. An exhibit may only win one Group Final in a show season (Spring to Autumn), should the same article be entered again and found to have already won a Group Final in the same show season the exhibitor must forfeit/refund any and all prizes and will be disqualified from exhibiting for 12 months.
12. Late entries not accepted.

**VAS LTD CROCHET COMPETITION** - To be conducted at Society, Group and State Level.

State Level Prizes - 1st - Trophy & \$300 Spotlight Voucher 2nd - \$150 Spotlight Voucher 3rd - \$50 Spotlight Voucher

**Rule & Regulations**

1. **An article of crochet no larger than 50cm on any one side, made from pure wool/wool blend of any ply.**
2. Exhibitor to attach label from wool used or receipt from the woollen mill.
3. Each exhibit entered must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.
4. An exhibit having won at a Show will compete at a Group Final. The winning exhibit will then compete in the State Final at the Royal Melbourne Show.
5. An exhibitor may represent only one local show at Group level and one Group at State level.
6. An exhibit having won at State Final is no longer eligible to compete in the competition.
7. If for any reason a winner is unable to compete at Group or State Final level then the second placegetter is eligible to compete.
8. A person will not be permitted to win at more than one Show within the State in any one Show year. Persons not adhering to this rule will be required to forfeit/refund prize money.
9. All work to have been completed in the last twelve (12) months prior to its entry at a local show/field day.
10. An exhibit may only win one Group Final in a Show season (Spring to Autumn), should the same article be entered again and found to have already won a Group Final in the same Show season the exhibitor must forfeit/refund any and all prizes and will be disqualified from exhibiting for 12 months.

**VAS LTD SEWING COMPETITION** - To be conducted at Society, Group and State Level.

State Level Prizes - 1st - Trophy & \$300 Spotlight Voucher 2nd - \$150 Spotlight Voucher 3rd - \$50 Spotlight Voucher

**Rule & Regulations -**

1. **The item is to be a tote/carry bag no larger than 50 cm on any one side.**
2. Handle/s to be made of fabric.
3. Minimum embellishments allowed.
4. Must be lined.
5. Sewn by machine.
6. May be hand finished.
7. Knitted/Crocheted items not acceptable.
8. To be constructed in fabric, using natural fibre or fibre-blend.
9. Each exhibit entered must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.
10. An exhibit having won at a Show will compete at a Group Final. The winning exhibit will then compete in the State Final at the Royal Melbourne Show.
11. An exhibitor may represent only one local show at Group level and one Group at State level.
12. An exhibit having won at State Final, is no longer eligible to compete in the competition.
13. If for any reason a winner is unable to compete at Group or State Final level then the second placegetter is eligible to compete.
14. A person will not be permitted to win at more than one Show within the State in any one Show year. Persons not adhering to this rule will be required to forfeit/refund prize money.
15. All work to have been completed in the last 12 months prior to its entry at a local show/field day.
16. An exhibit may only win one Group Final in a show season (Spring to Autumn), should the same article be entered again and found to have already won a Group Final in the same Show season the exhibitor must forfeit/refund any and all prizes and will be disqualified from exhibiting for 12 months.
17. Late entries not accepted.

**VAS LTD HAND EMBROIDERY COMPETITION** To be conducted at Society, Group and State Level.

#### **Rule & Regulations**

- 1. The exhibit to be an article of hand embroidery any type, excluding cross stitch.**
2. Each exhibit entered must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.
3. An exhibit having won at a Show will compete at a Group Final. The winning exhibit will then compete in the State Final at the Royal Melbourne Show.
4. An exhibitor may represent only one local Show at Group level and one Group at State level.
5. An exhibit having won at State Final, is no longer eligible to compete in the competition.
6. If for any reason a winner is unable to compete at Group or State Final level then the second placegetter is eligible to compete.
7. A person will not be permitted to win at more than one show within the State in any one Show year. Persons not adhering to this rule will be required to forfeit/refund prize money.
8. All work to have been completed in the last twelve (12) months prior to its entry at a local show/field day.

**VAS LTD PATCHWORK COMPETITION** - To be conducted at Society, Group and State Level.  
State Level Prizes - 1st - Trophy & \$300 Spotlight Voucher 2nd - \$150 Spotlight Voucher 3rd - \$50 Spotlight Voucher

#### **Rule & Regulations**

- 1. The exhibit is to be not more than one metre on any one side.**
2. Machine pieced and machine quilted.
3. Minimal Embellishments. Small amount only not to overpower patchwork.
4. Each exhibit entered must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.
5. An exhibit having won at a Show will compete at a Group Final. The winning exhibit will then compete in the State Final at the Royal Melbourne Show.
6. An exhibitor may represent only one local show at Group level and one Group at State level.
7. An exhibit having won at State Final, is no longer eligible to compete in the competition.
8. If for any reason a winner is unable to compete at Group or State Final level then the second placegetter is eligible to compete.
9. A person will not be permitted to win at more than one Show within the State in any one Show year. Persons not adhering to this rule will be required to forfeit/refund prize money.
10. All work to have been completed in the last twelve (12) months prior to its entry at a local show/field day.
