**REGULATIONS**

- Entries to be delivered between 4pm-6pm on Thursday 1st November and Friday 2nd November 8am-10am with EXHIBIT ticket attached. **Age of child to be written on exhibit ticket.**
- Entries to be collected after 4.30pm on Sunday 4th November, 2018 or between 9am and 10am on Monday 5th November 2018.
- Prize cards vouchers to be collected on Saturday or Sunday during the Show.
- The Society accepts no responsibility for the safe return of entries (although all care shall be exercised).
- Judging takes place on Friday 3rd November. The Judge reserves the right to transfer an entry to another class where this is considered appropriate.
- All exhibits are to be grown by the Exhibitor and not previously placed.
- Entries will be judged on uniformity and quality of produce. A bunch is 4 pieces.
- Entries consisting of a collection of several kinds will also be judged on arrangement. Collection basket of home grown garden produce only require 4 items per kind if under 10cm in either length, diameter or height, otherwise only one item is required per kind. Baskets not to exceed 55cm x 45cm.
- All square bales must be full and intact. Pastures representing not less than 2 hectares (5 acres), in containers supplied by the Society.
- Necklace made from vegetables not to exceed 50cm in length. Minimum age of entrant for classes 1-8 is 15 years.

**SASHES AND TROPHIES**

- CHAMPION EXHIBITOR to the Exhibitor gaining the most aggregate points in the Garden Produce Section, Classes 16 to 33.
- CHAMPION EXHIBITOR will be awarded to the child who gains the most aggregate points in the Garden Produce Section in Age Group 3-7 & Age 8-15 from Classes 34-46. Prizes sponsored by **MR FOTHERGILL SEEDS PTY LTD.**
- Points will be awarded: 3 for First; 2 for Second; 1 for Third.
- A \$100 Trophy donated by **G.R. & B.J. HUNTER, FERTILISER & LIME DISTRIBUTORS, Eden Park**, will be awarded to the Exhibitor gaining the highest points in classes 4, 5 and 7.

**CITY OF WHITTLESEA PERPETUAL TROPHY**

A Trophy valued at \$300 donated by the City of Whittlesea will be awarded to the Exhibitor who gains the highest number of combined points in the **Commercial Beef Cattle (Group FE), Commercial Beef Herd (Group FD), Domestic Trade Cattle (Group FC), Hoof Competition (Group FFF), Pen of Three Steers and a Pen of Three Replacement Heifers (Group FG), Sheep and Prime Lambs (Group GD) and Farm & Garden (Group 0) – Farm Produce (Classes 1-7)** sections of the Whittlesea Show.

A Perpetual Trophy donated by the City of Whittlesea will be inscribed with the winner's name. The Trophy is to be held by the City of Whittlesea.

An exhibitor is only entitled to have the highest points they achieve in each class counted towards the aggregate total for this Trophy. For Example: Exhibitor enters 2 exhibits in Farm Produce Class 7 – Bale of Meadow Hay. They win 1st and 3rd prize. Only the 1st prize points will be counted towards the aggregate total. Points will be awarded 3 for 1st, 2 for 2nd and 1 for 3rd.
